Do Americans get free solar panels?

American homeowners might be eligible for federal tax credits for solar installations or state subsidies for solar energy, but not free panels. The U.S. government does not provide free solar panels, said a U.S. Department of Energy spokesperson. The department urges people to report scams to the .

Are 'free solar panel health checks' a scam?

We're regularly contacted by customers, who have received an unsolicited call or letter from another company, offering them a 'free solar panel health check' or warning about their solar PV system being at risk of failing. This is a common scam.

How do I avoid solar scams?

One of the best ways to avoid solar scams is to have an understanding of how much solar panels cost before you are approached with a quote that sounds (and is) too good to be true. That way you have a sense of a fair market price and better able to identify outliers. There are a few ways to go about this.

False advertising for "free solar panels from the government" is perhaps the most common solar scam, especially on social media platforms. This is especially shameful because it detracts from the genuine local government solar panels programs helping low-income and disadvantaged communities reduce their energy cost burden.

They do this by offering free solar system installations, which are financed through solar lease agreements or power purchase agreements. In these arrangements, homeowners agree to buy the solar energy produced by the panels at a discounted rate, allowing the solar company to recoup their initial investment and make a profit over time.
