Are gas stations in Iceland self-serve?

Diesel pumps have a black handle while regular gas pumps have a green handle. We decided that the fact that gas stations in Iceland are self-serve is necessary to add to this list as many people around the world aren't used to doing it themselves and we want to let you know exactly how to pump gas in Iceland.

How do Icelandic gas stations work?

This is vividly reflected in the functioning of Icelandic gas stations, which primarily operate on a self-service basis. Upon arrival at a gas station, you will typically find automated pumps. To fuel up, insert your debit card into the designated slot in the machine, and you will be prompted to enter your Personal Identification Number (PIN).

How often do you need a gas station in Iceland?

Usually, they are placed every 30 miles around Ring Road. If you have a credit card, make sure to request one with a pin before leaving or have a backup. Luckily, Iceland built gas stations along some of the most popular routes, making it easy for visitors to explore the country.

Gas Prices in Iceland . The cost of fuel in Iceland fluctuates constantly. From 1998 to 2023, the average was 2.50 ISK (1.80 US \$)* per liter. In June 2023, gas prices soared to an all-time high of 3.60 ISK (2.60 US \$)*. Fuel prices also vary throughout the country, so it's best to plan ahead for your trip if you want to budget the costs of refilling your tanks.

You do not actually need a credit card with a pin to get fuel, because there are other options. Set up contactless with Google wallet or Apple Pay. Or buy a prepaid gas card when you arrive, N1 station is most common. Or, pay the attendant when you fuel up. If the station is unmanned or closed, then use the prepaid gas card.
